This summer, each book read counts toward BOTH of these reading programs!




Build a Better World: Summer Reading Club


YOUTH PROGRAMS

Students in grades 4-6 can test their engineering skills through different design challenges. Content themes: Engineering, Careers in Science, Forces and Interaction. Registration required.




