PROS	CONS
In the case of your hard drive crashing or your camera's memory being lost, you have back-ups of your photos.	Limitations on storage space - often a few gigabytes.
It makes it easier to share your photos with friends and family.	Anyone else in the world can see your photos unless you watch your privacy settings carefully.
You have access to your photos anywhere you have access to the internet.	You may not always have access to the internet - and service providers sometimes go out of business.

### Flickr www.flickr.com


- www.filckr.com
- 1 terabyte of photo and video storage.
- Can upload photos up to 200 MB, videos up to 1 GB, and you have unlimited monthly bandwidth.
- With paid account, get 2 TB of storage and no ads.

### **Picasa/Google Drive**

### picasaweb.google.com

- Works with Picasa desktop application can upload from app or though browser.
- 15 GB of free storage across Google Drive, Gmail, and Google + photos.
- Images limited to 20MB each in Picasa.
